What is Title I?

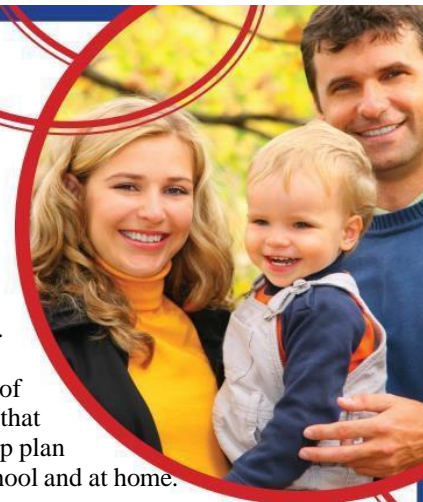
Lucy C. Laney is identified as a Title I school as part of every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Lucy C. Laney will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Laney values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Lucy C. Laney will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Lucy C. Laney invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event. If the plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school will submit any comments to the district office.

Who is it for?

All Lucy C. Laney students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Lucy C. Laney will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center

2024-2025 District Goals

During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%.

During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase post – high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate from 81% to 83%.

During the 2024-2025 school year, we will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in RCSS by 3%.

2024-2025 School Goals

Increase the percentage of students performing at or above the developing level on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in all content areas by 6 percentage points, raising the school overall average from 37% to 43% by the end of the 24-25 SY.

Increase the percentage of students reading on grade level from 35% to 45%, as measured by the NWEA MAP Benchmark Assessment, by the end of the 24-25 SY.

Decrease the number of disciplinary referrals by 26%, reducing them from 542 to 400, by the end of the 24-25 SY.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Lucy C. Laney and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade- level standards. The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during school events and meetings.

Learn various math strategies, strengthen your student math skills, and how to have fun with learning math at home.

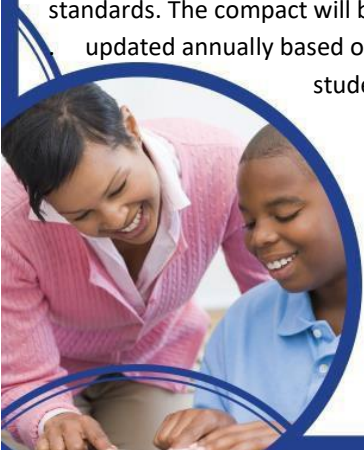
*****Science Curriculum Day – January 7, 2025 Report Card Day

***** Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, flyers, Robo calls, marquee, and included thru Canvas platform.

***** Provide workshops and trainings for all faculty and staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication and work with parents as equal partners and ideas to increase family engagement.
