

District Goals:

The system goals are...

- 1. During the 2020-2021school year, RCSS will increase the number of highly effective teachers and leaders hired and retained in RCSS by 3% to impact academic achievement across all content areas.

- Implement Sadlier Vocabulary workshop grade 3-5 to support students in acquiring new vocabulary, developing figurative language, word relationships, and nuances in word meanings.

K-5 Numbers & Operations:

- Implement strategies in grades K-2 to increase students' computational fluency.
- Use of Number Talks grades K-5

- **SMART GOAL:** Decrease the number of student missing 10 or more days of school by 3%
