What is Title I?

Monte Sano Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Monte Sano Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Monte Sano Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Monte Sano Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Monte Sano Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum this fall to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Monte Sano Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the Richmond County Parent and Family Engagement Plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. The Monte Sano Parent and Family Engagement Plan will also be posted on the school website and at the Title 1 Annual Meeting. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2022-2023 District Goals

1. During the 2022-2023 school year, we will utilize technology and the Richmond County School System Instructional Framework to increase academic achievement across all tested content areas by 3%.
2. During the 2022-2023 school year, through our Induction Support Program we will increase the percentage of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in Richmond County School System by 3%.
3. During the 2022-2023 school year, we will increase the graduation rate from 73.77% to 75% by a continued focus on the strategy map and working to produce graduates that meet the Richmond County School System Profile of a Graduate.

2022-2023 School Goals

Monte Sano will increase the number of students achieving on grade level by 3% in **Reading** and in **Math** by the end of year i-Ready diagnostic. Also, MSE will improve the working **climate** and build capacity while improving engagement with students.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Monte Sano Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compact will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, teachers, and all other stakeholders. The school-parent compacts

also are shared with parents during Open House, the Title 1 Annual Meeting, online, during parent-teacher conferences and in the Parent Resource Center.

Monte Sano Elementary is Branching Out!

Monte Sano Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in an understandable format and language and posted on the school website.
- ✓ Provide trainings for staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ✓ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
