

What is Title !?

- ▶ **Title I**, Part A (**Title I**) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) provides financial assistance to local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards.
- Schools operate two types of Title I programs-
- * Targeted Assistance- Serves a select group of students based on the most "at-risk" factors
- * School Wide- Everyone regardless of need benefits and receives Title I support.



Parent and Family Engagement Policies (LEA & Schools)

In order to receive Title I funds, districts must conduct outreach to parents and family members and must implement <u>programs</u>, <u>activities</u> and procedures for the involvement of parents and families in Title I funded activities. Each district must jointly develop with and distribute to families, in a language they can understand, a written parent and family engagement policy. The engagement policy must be periodically updated to reflect the needs of families and be incorporated into the district plans described above. Title I-receiving schools in the district must also distribute parent and family engagement policies agreed to by the parents.




LEA Parent and Family Engagement Policy

- School Districts: The district parent and family engagement policy must describe how the district will:
 - Involve parents in the joint <u>development</u> of the district plan;
 - Provide the support necessary to assist schools in implementing <u>effective family engagement</u> activities;
 - Conduct an annual evaluation of the effectiveness of the policy in improving the academic quality of Title I schools, including <u>identifying barriers</u> to greater participation by families, (especially family members who are economically disadvantaged, disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are a racial or ethnic minority) and use the findings to design strategies to support successful school and family interactions and revise engagement policies; and
 - Involve families in <u>schools activities</u>, which may include establishing an advisory board to develop, revise and review the engagement policy.

Title I Schools:



Our Goals for Student Achievement

DISTRICT GOALS

The Board of Education sets goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2020-2021 are:

Reading - All students on grade level by the end of 3rd grade.

Math - All students on grade level by the end of 4th grade.

MONTE SANO ELEMENTARY GOALS

Reading - To increase reading proficiency on the GA Milestones by 15% over 3 years. To accomplish this goal, our school will:

- Focus on better phonological awareness, phonics, and high frequency words instruction in K-2nd grades
- Focus on better vocabulary skills by explicitly teaching vocabulary through daily read alouds

Math - To increase math proficiency on the GA Milestones by 15% over 3 years. To accomplish this goal, our school will:

- Focus on a deeper understanding of numbers and operations by being more consistent and diligent about using manipulatives in the beginning of a unit of study (especially in K-2nd grades)
- Focus on students becoming more fluent in math facts
 - * K-2nd Addition and subtraction facts
 - * 3rd-5th Multiplication and Division facts



When teachers, students, and families work together, we CAN achieve our goals!

Teachers, Parents, Students - Together for Success In the School At Home

In the classroom, teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Provide students with meaningful homework that will keep parents informed of the current learning taking place in the classroom
- Keep school and teacher websites up to date to keep parents informed about current learning goals and activities
- Send home graded papers weekly to keep parents informed of students performance, conduct, and work habits
- Offer suggestions for strategies, extra practice, suggested tutoring options, and form a unified plan for success.
- Contact parents to schedule a conference to discuss when students are in danger of failing

Monte Sano parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to

- Have fun with math. Use fun items in the home for manipulatives, i.e. cereal, pennies, goldfish, pom poms,
- Try to attend all school events designed to offer support, resources, and ideas that would facilitate learning at home
- Encourage i-Ready practice at home since it is specifically designed for each individual child's needs
- Monitor that homework is completed and reviewed for quality and understanding so parents can clear up misunderstandings
- Look for flyers, newsletters, and any other form of communication from the school daily
- Contact teachers when they are concerned about their students progress, grades, or behavior

Monte Sano students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

Daily communicate homework with parents and ask them to review homework before

- returning to school

 Share all forms of communication, flyers, newsletters, agendas, daily
- Share all forms of communication, flyers, newsletters, agendas, daily folders, graded papers, etc., with parents
- Be consistent and committed to independently read daily, Monday through Thursday nights to improve reading skills
- · Put forth effort to complete i-Ready lessons at home
- · Set learning goals for self, communicate, and track these goals with parents






