What is Title I?

RCTCM is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how RCTCM will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. RCTCM values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that RCTCM will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

RCTCM School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. RCTCM will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.


Where is it available?


*Goal #1 During the 24-25 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 5%

School Improvement Goal (SIP)
