We love her and French would not be the same without her.






This year's Thanksgiving Holidays started early with an extra special ceremony. A local Mason's lodge, whose namesake we share, presented us with a portrait of John Shelton


The Math Bowls are always exciting and full of tense hopefullness. Asking for a homerun problem... the only sound is the pencil on paper...a round of applause... and the games go on.




John Stracke was recognized for his high individual score at the Parkview High School Math Contest.

In Charleston, SC, Jennifer Jackson won in the 10th grade division and John Stracke won in the 11th grade division for computers.





















ROUMEROUM MEROUM MEROUM

sometime.




