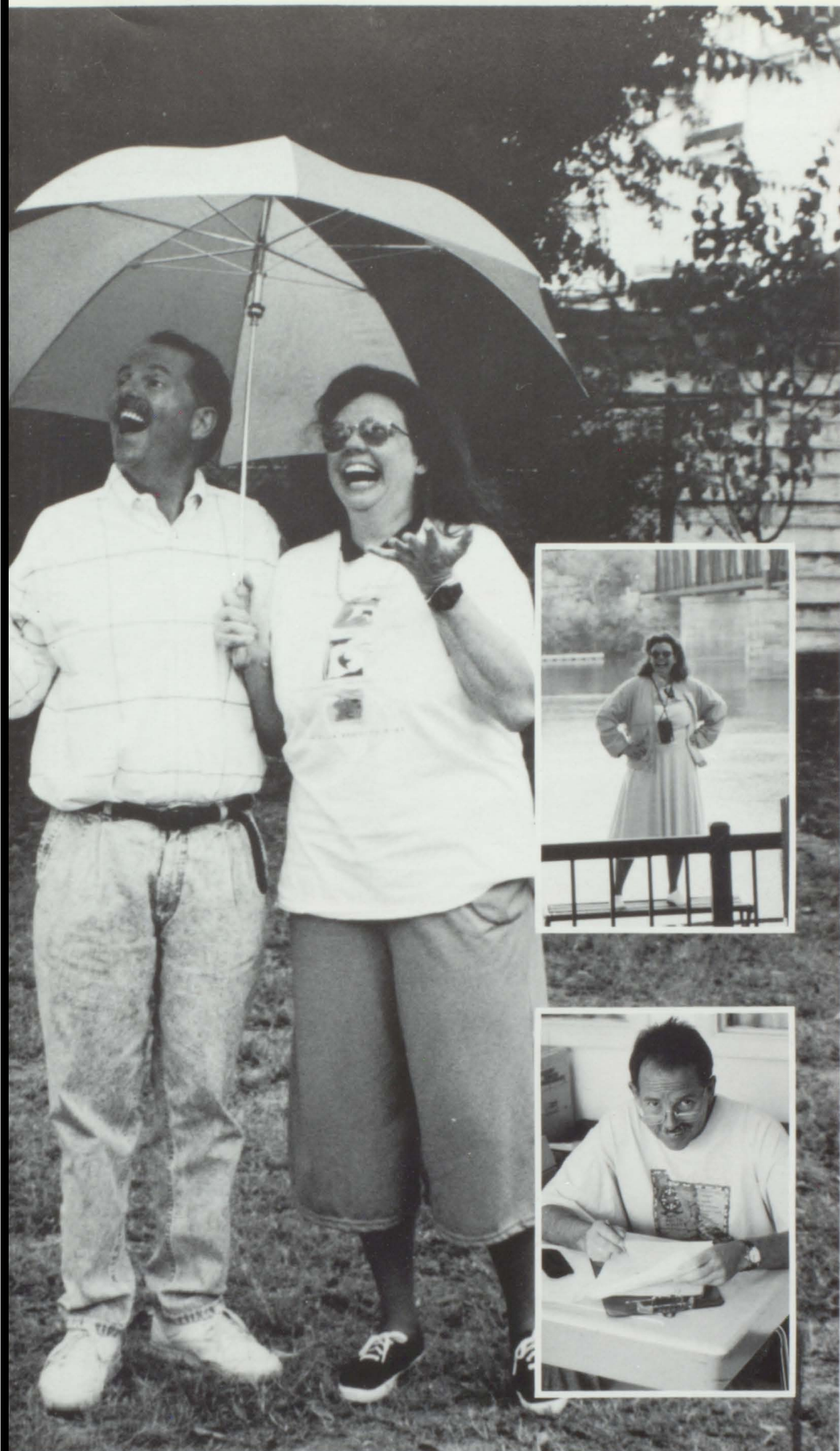
OUR **HEROES**

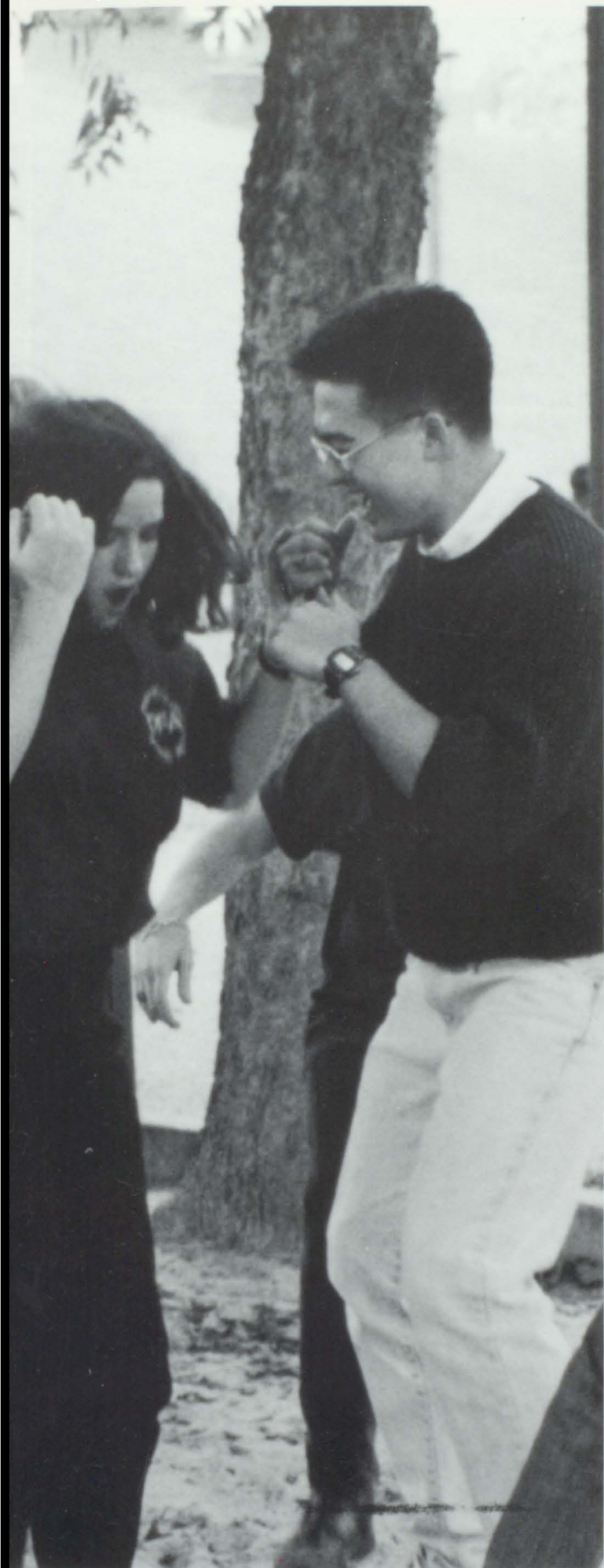
Senior week gave this year's seniors time to participate in their last year of school at Davidson. They will have fond memories of Davidson and hopefully a few pleasant memories of senior week.

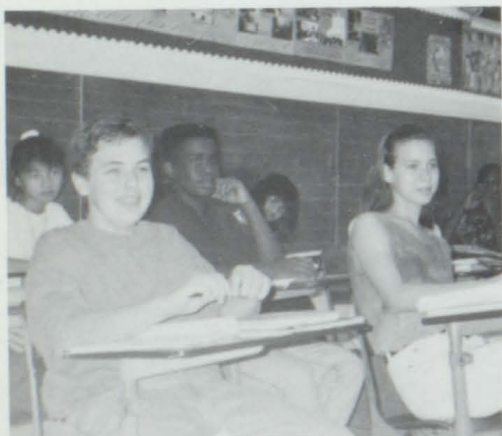


EIGHTH ... A GOOD VINTAGE
