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## What Does a School Counselor Do?

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- Classroom guidance
- Group counseling
- Individual counseling
- Parent & staff consultation
- Assist with student transitions into & out of WRES
- Interpret assessment results
- Assist with academic intervention plans & implementation
- Conflict resolution
- Coordinate school-wide programs
- Crisis intervention
- Referrals

## Classroom Guidance

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Classroom guidance lessons are developed from state & county adopted curriculums. Lessons cover information including:

- Academic organizational, study, & test-taking skills
- Goal setting & decision-making
- Career exploration & planning
- Self-esteem
- Peer relationships
- Coping strategies
- Social skills
- Effective communication
- Problem-solving & conflict resolution
- Substance abuse education
- Multicultural/diversity awareness

## Referrals

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A student may be referred to the counselor by:

- Teachers
- Parents
- Administrators
- Student (self-referral)

## Permission

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Counselors obtain parental permission to see students for individual and group sessions. Counselors may meet with a student once without parental permission. If there is a need to see the student again, then parental permission is required.
