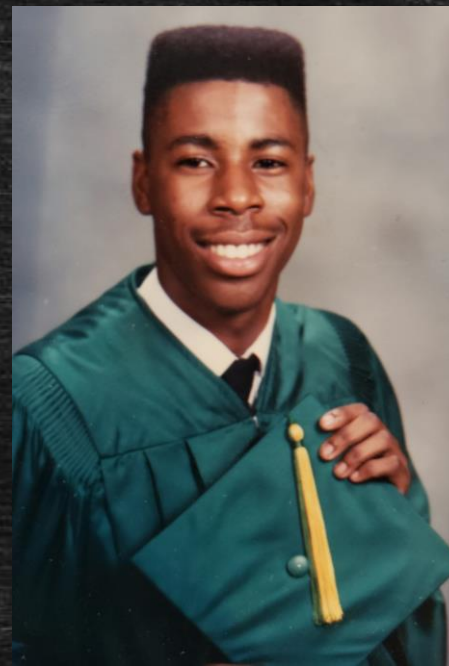






# Meet the TEACHER
