




Welcome to Ms. Murphy and Mrs. McGhee's

Class Rules and Expectations

- 1. Students must be respectful at ALL times.
- 2. Students must keep ALL of their personal belongings (i.e. hands, feet, and other items) to themselves.
- 3. Students must raise their hands in order to speak and get up out of their seats.
- 4. Students must follow ALL directions when they are given.
- 5. Students must come EVERYDAY with the necessary materials to learn.

Homework Policy

Homework is an extension to the instruction that your child received during the school day. We are asking that your child completes their homework nightly. Not all homework assignments will be written. More details relating to homework will be in the weekly newsletter. If your child does not complete their homework, it will negatively impact their conduct grade.

Behavior/Conduct Policy

We use a positive behavior plan to help with behavior through Class Dojo. (please make sure to sign up in order to stay informed). In the event that we have to provide consequences, we use the following steps:

- 1. Verbal warning
- 2. Silent lunch/ walk at recess (5minutes)
 - 3. Walk at recess (entire time)
- 4. Call to parent and time out in another classroom
 - 5. Parent Conference
 - 6. Office referral









Tardy Policy

Breakfast starts promptly at 7:50 a.m. each day. Students will be marked tardy if they come after 8:20 a.m. The instructional day starts at 8:20 a.m. promptly until 3:05 p.m.
