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What is Title I?

Goshen Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Goshen Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Goshen Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Goshen Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised? Goshen Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Goshen Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will email the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2025-2026 District Goals

Student Achievement • During the 25-26 school year, we will increase student content mastery in tested subject areas on the Georgia Milestones by 6%. • During the 25-26 school year, we will increase post-high school readiness by increasing our graduation rate by 2%.

Talent Development • During 25-26, we will increase teacher and support staff retention by 3% through consistent, meaningful employee evaluations.

Safe & Secure Learning Environment • During the 25-26 school year, we will reduce chronic absenteeism by 3%. • During the 25-26 school year, we will improve the on-time delivery rate of student transportation services by 5%

2025-2026 School Goals

Student Achievement - By May 2026, 20% of students (93 students) will increase by one grade level as measured by the iReady EOY Reading Diagnostic and 13% of 3rd-5th grade students (30 students) will move out of beginning level learner as measured by the EOG ELA GMAS.

Student Achievement - By May 2026, more than 90% of teachers (26) will score level 3 or 4 for TKES Standard 7, Positive Learning Environment, as measured by the TKES platform.

Safe & Secure Learning Environment - By May 2026, 25% of students (106 students) will increase by one grade level as measured by the iReady EOY Reading Diagnostic and 13% of 3rd-5th grade students

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Goshen Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Community Cares event and the School Forum. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

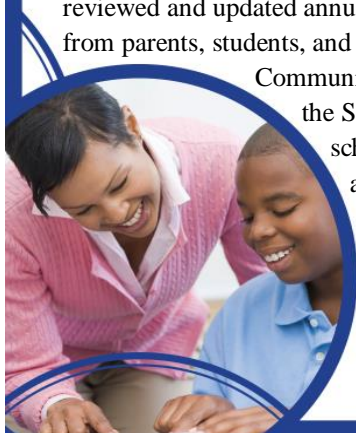

Goshen Elementary is Branching Out!

Goshen Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ✓ Provide monthly trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ✓ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish on the school blog and in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ✓ Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
- ✓ Offer Infinite Campus account set up and assistance with usage for parents and family members to monitor their child's progress.
- ✓ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events, place input cards around the building and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
