COMMUNICATION:

The best way to reach us is via Class Dojo! We will use Class Dojo to share important dates, information, and documents. We will also send out a weekly newsletter via Class Dojo. If there are any changes in your child's afternoon transportation, please send us a message ASAP.

ATTENDANCE:

All absences require a written note from parents/guardians stating the reason for the absence. The note must include the student's full name, reason for absence, date(s) of absence, and parent/guardian signature. A note without a reason and date of absence is unexcused. Parents are allowed 5 Parent Excused absences per school year. After the five are used, then a doctor's note or other official documentation must be sent in or the absence will be unexcused.

In order to comply with district regulations and state law, when a student has 10 unexcused absences in one month or ten unexcused absences in one year, Richmond County administrators will petition the Juvenile Court System to seek mandatory attendance by a student.

Students are not allowed on campus prior to 6:50 a.m. Any student reporting to the classroom after 7:25 a.m. is tardy. A parent must sign in tardy students.

The accumulation of unexcused tardies may warrant disciplinary action and/or referral to Department of Family and Children Services.

GRADING:

Grades 4 and up are percentage-based grades.

The fourth-grade teachers will send home graded student work every 2 weeks. Please review the work, then sign and return ALL papers so we can keep them on file.

You can also see your child's grades via the Parent Portal on Infinite Campus. You can find information about creating and accessing an account on the RCBOE website.

MOOSE NOTEBOOK:

Students in fourth-grade will use a MOOSE Notebook. This is their binder that they will bring to school daily. MOOSE stands for Management of Organizational Skills Everyday. The MOOSE Notebook will be divided into subject sections and will be used to organize and keep important classwork, papers, homework, and other documents. Please check your child's MOOSE Notebook frequently.

TECHNOLOGY:

Freedom Park is a 1:1 technology school and each student will receive a Richmond County laptop to use for the school year.

Parents have the option for their child to take their laptop home. If you want your child to bring their laptop home, we must have a signed permission form from you. If your child takes their laptop home, they must bring it back to school charged. After the 3rd time of a laptop coming back to school uncharged or the laptop is left at home, the laptop will no longer be allowed to go home.

SCHOOL NUTRITION:

Breakfast is free for all students at Freedom Park. Fourth-grade lunch time is 11:00am-11:30pm. Students may also bring one snack to have at the end of the day.

BULLYING:

Bullying behavior is defined as any pattern of written or verbal expression or any physical act or gesture that is intended to ridicule, humiliate, intimidate, or cause measurable physical or emotional distress upon one or more students.

A third instance of bullying in a school year would require that the student be assigned to an alternative educational setting. However, the principal or other appropriate designee may recommend the Alternative Center or suspension, in her discretion prior to the third offense. If you believe your child is being bullied, please notify the homeroom teacher. Also, there is a digital Bullying or Harassment Parent Form located on the RCBOE website that you can fill out – once you submit the form, it will go directly to administration.

GMAS TESTING:

All fourth-grade students will take the Georgia Milestones Assessment at the end of the school year. They will be tested in the areas of Math and ELA.
