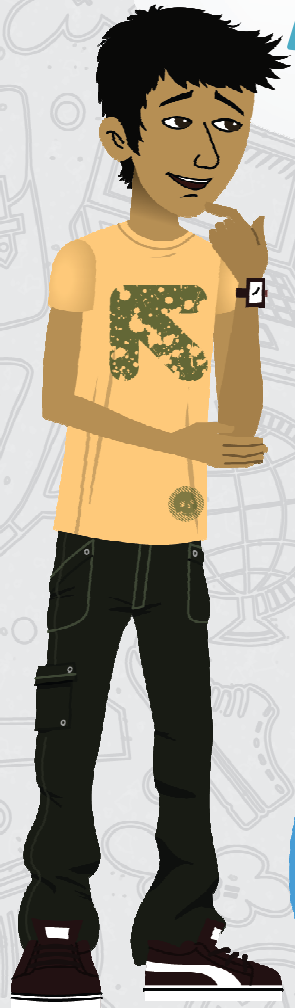

Some good things to know:

- *i-Ready* is a test **that adapts to you.**
- You will see questions that seem very simple and others that are more difficult until it finds questions that are **“just right”** for you.
- You may get **questions you have not learned yet.**
- If you rush, **you may have to restart** the test.
