Course Syllabus 2021-2022 School Year Band/Chorus/General Music

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Band This performance-based class focuses on basic instrumental skill development and music reading. The goal of this class is to teach students the proper way to hold and play a brass, percussion, or woodwind instrument with the characteristic tone quality of the instrument. Students can elect to play their instrument of choice with the band director's approval and recommendation. Participation in concert performances outside of the regular class hours is required. In addition to large group ensembles, individual growth and achievement are encouraged through participation in solo and ensemble festivals, district honor bands and private lessons. Participation in concert performances outside of regular class hours is required.

Chorus This performance-based class focuses on learning to use the vocal instrument to create a healthy and pleasing sound. In addition to learning proper vocal production and technique, students learn music reading skills, sight-singing skills, and performance skills. Students sing literature with and without accompaniment in up to three parts. Chorus offers opportunities for students to develop team building and leadership skills. Participation in concert performances outside of regular class hours is required.

General Music The purpose of the general music course is to develop comprehensive musicianship with a focus of musical literacy. The course allows students to transfer prior knowledge and skills and to explore and develop their musicianship through various courses of study such as music history, theory, and performance.

Students who successfully complete 7th and 8th grade Band/Chorus (consecutively) in Middle School are eligible to receive 1 High School credit. Students must complete each year with passing grades.

For grading purposes, all music students are required to produce and present quality work in <u>one or more</u> of the following formats:

- Public performances
- · Visual displays such as poster boards and trifolds
- Audio and/or video recordings (CD, mp3, DVD)
- Web-based presentations such as blog entries and web site content

<u>COVID-19 Requirements</u>: Students are not able to share instruments. Therefore, individual instruments are <u>required</u> and must be either <u>rented or purchased</u>.

ATTENDANCE: Students are responsible for making up any missed work. Students will have *4 days* to submit make-up assignments. Any work submitted after those *4 days <u>will not</u>* be accepted. Student study groups will be established at the beginning of the semester to provide additional support. Students who are not in their seats at the scheduled time- *whether they are in or out of the classroom* -will be marked *TARDY* unless they have a pass from another teacher or administrator. Parents will be contacted if their child is excessively tardy (more than 3 times per nine weeks).

GRADE RECOVERY: Grade recovery is imbedded into the class. Any assignment may be redone for a better grade. Additional assignments will not be given at the end of the quarter to receive a higher grade. The expectations of responsibility and accountability foster an environment of consistency for both student and parent/guardian to check on grades regularly. It is Ms. Burns' responsibility to make sure grades are up to date at the end of every week. This will help everyone know if a student is in danger of failing and what they need to do to make a passing Grade.

Classroom Procedures

Upon entering classroom:

- Take out **all** instruments and/or materials needed **at the start of class**. Immediately begin working on "Do Now" activities and warm-up lessons, unless otherwise instructed.
- Sharpening pencils should take place **at the beginning of class**. If pencils need to be sharpened, the class helper will at one time collect all pencils when instructed.

Restroom Passes:

• For safety and security, students are allowed restroom opportunity following direct instruction at the beginning of the class and prior to the last 10 minutes of class, unless an alteration is made in the schedule. Accommodations will be made for students with doctor's notes only.

Makeup Lessons:

• If students miss a lesson, that student will have the opportunity to make up their work through *The Canvas LMS*. It is the responsibility of the student to manage their time appropriately and make arrangements for completion.

Classroom Journals/Folders/Music Books:

• All journals, folders and music books are located on/in the Student Workstation upon entering the classroom. All journals/folders/music books may be gathered at the beginning of class and returned at the end of class upon exiting.

Upon exiting classroom:

• After all items are completely packed and all materials placed in their proper location, students will line up to the right of the door exiting in an orderly manner with appropriate volume.
