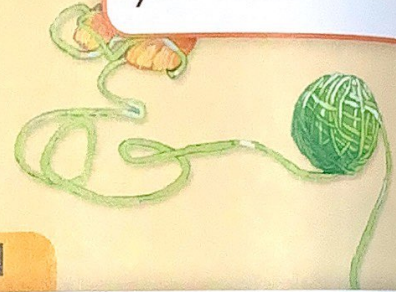
Sentences

Writing Trait
