


Talk About It Did the author write a funny story? Find and read one part of the story that made you laugh.

Look Back and Write Pig gets sick. Look back at pages 43–44. What makes Pig feel better? Make a list.










Talk About It How is Ox helpful? Find and read one part of the story that shows how helpful he is.
