Course Description:

This course is primarily a performance class. Students will perform assigned pieces of music and participate with other students to demonstrate an evolving understanding and proficiency in his/her chosen string instrument. Knowledge of Western classical music history, terminology, and theory will also be included.

Your grade will be based on daily preparation/discussion, daily performance, weekly practice charts, attendance at required auditions, rehearsal, and concerts, and completion of music history and theory assignments.

All Assignments are expected to be completed by the end of class unless otherwise specified. You are expected to be at rehearsals on Tuesday nights. If there is a reason that you cannot be at practice, you are expected to communicate this to your teacher before practice begins. If it is a last-minute issue, please let your teacher know as soon as possible.

Required Textbook and Materials

Please purchase Muller Rusch book 3 for your instrument. I will provide the other music that is required. However, it is the student's responsibility to bring the following to class everyday: an instrument (or tell me you are requesting use of a county-owned instrument, a pencil, and the notebook and music I will give you. Further, all students will be responsible for the maintenance of his/ her instrument, whether owned by the student or the county. All students will also keep the classroom orderly by placing all materials in designated area. Students should all have blocks of rosin. There has been a developing problem of mites "eating" the hair off of bows due to rosin sharing. Share rosin at your own risk. Students are also responsible for replacing broken strings.
