By the end of the 2019-2020 school year, the percentage of students performing on grade level in all subject areas will increase by 5 percentage points as measured by district mandated assessments.

-Comprehension Skills and the ability to apply learned skills to new text (K-2<sup>nd</sup>)

**Objective 2:** To increase proficiency in math by 10%, our school will focus on, developing fluency in the following FOCUS areas:

-Missing Number to build number sense, counting and identify numbers (K-2) -Number Facts to build fluency with addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts (1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup>) -Computation using number facts to be able to accurately and quickly compute math problems (1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup>)

-Explain the procedures of problem solving through constructive response  $(1^{st} - 2^{nd})$ 

#### 2019-2020 School Goals Continued

**Objective 1:** To increase proficiency in reading by 10%, our school will focus on, developing fluency in the following FOCUS areas:

-Oral Reading Fluency on grade level (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) -Comprehension Skills and the ability to apply learned skills to new text (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>) -Determine/compare themes to make connections

between texts and the real world (3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>) -Oral Reading Fluency on grade level (6<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup>)

-Comprehension Skills and the ability to apply learned skills to new text, focusing of informational texts ( $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ )

-Understanding the writing process: pre-writing, draft, editing, re-writing

-Practice using different writing styles: informative, argumentative, narrative and explanatory

**Objective 2:** To increase proficiency in math by 10%, our school will focus on, developing fluency in the following FOCUS areas:

-Number Facts to build fluency with addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts (3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>) -Computation using number facts to be able to accurately and quickly compute math problems -Compute multiplication and division problems with fluency and accuracy (3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>)

-Develop a clear understanding of fractions: equivalent and adding/subtraction (3<sup>rd</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>)

-Explain the procedures of problem solving through constructive response

-Number Fluency (6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>)

-Computing fractions focusing on equivalent, rate, ration, proportional with fluency and accuracy (6<sup>th</sup> -7<sup>th</sup>) -Understanding and solving functions: linear, models and tables (8<sup>th</sup>)

-Solving systems such as equations, inequalities and exponents  $(6^{th}-8^{th})$

Richmond Hill K-8 will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Keep parents informed about their child's academic progress and changes in behavior
- Send home daily or weekly homework assignments
- Develop reading and math goals based on student data and assist students in reaching them

- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers
