2019-20 District Goals

By the end of the 2019-2020 school year, the percentage of students performing on grade level in all subject areas will increase by 5 percentage points as measured by district mandated assessments.

2019-20 School Goals

Goal 1: 3RD GRADERS READING ON LEVEL

Increase the percent of students with a Lexile level within the Lexile "stretch" grade band. (Target:1st- 360L, 2nd- 535L, 3rd- 670L, 4th-840L, 5th-920L) By May 2020 at least 3% from 17.7% to 21% of the students in grades 3rd-5th in their grade level appropriate Lexile "stretch band" according to the 2019-2020 ELA GMAS results.

Goal 2: 4TH GRADERS Proficient IN MATH

Increase the percentage of students performing on or above grade level in mathematics by 4th grade by at least 3% from 13.4% in 18-19 to at least 16% in 19-20 according to GMAS scores, by Increasing growth in math reasoning when solving contextualized, multi-step word problems.

Goal 3: 3Rd-5TH GRADE

Improved growth mindset by April 2020, 90% of 3rd-5th grade students will demonstrate an increase in growth mindset as measured by the Georgia Student Health Survey.
