Students, Parents, and Guardians,

Welcome to Forensic Science at Hephzibah High School! We are very excited to engage you in forensics—the application of science for solving crimes. This is a course rich in exploration and lab investigation which applies many disciplines of scientific study such as biology/anatomy, chemistry, and physics to solving crimes.

I believe your experience in forensic science will be one to remember—the cases are fascinating, the labs engaging, and the content a satisfying application of all sciences studied up to this point. Plan to actively participate in class, complete all assignments thoughtfully and on time, and to study regularly outside of class.

II. Course Content Standards

IV. Classroom Expectations

VII. Policies & Procedures:

i. <u>ATTENDANCE:</u>

In order to succeed in this class a student MUST be present whether virtual or face to face. After returning from an absence, it is the student's responsibility to retrieve the assignments and the notes missed when absent for any reason. **Make-up work will only be addressed during independent work time during class. Students must see Ms.Sullivan during tutorial hours** or by appointment to receive any assistance with make-up work. Remember: STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING UP ALL ASSIGNMENTS AND NOTES MISSED DUE TO AN ABSENCE FOR <u>ANY</u> REASON.

ii. <u>TARDINESS</u>:

Tardy students will not be admitted into the classroom without an excuse from the front office. A student is considered tardy if they are not inside of the classroom when the tardy bell rings. Loitering in the hallway or at the classroom door until the bell rings is prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.

iii. MAKE-UP WORK:

It is the student's responsibility to inquire about what assignments, notes, and class work they have missed when they are absent. Work turned in after the due date will be graded for reduced credit. As a general rule, a three (3)

day window is given to complete missed assignments upon return to school. Make-up work will only be addressed during independent work time during class. Students must see Ms.Sullivan during tutorial hours by appointment to receive any assistance with make-up work.

While it is expected that students will discuss homework and classwork assignments, a student should never submit another person's work or ideas as their own. This also includes copying from the internet. Quizzes, tests, and exams are always individual assignments and are never collaborative.

If a student is observed copying answers from another student's completed work or attempts to submit another's work or ideas as their own, then a grade of **"O"** will be assigned.


V. DO NOT BRING TO CLASS:
