**Overview:** Latin II is a continuation of the study of classical Latin using a reading approach to language acquisition. Students will learn more advanced grammar, vocabulary and culture through readings about a Latin family and their experiences in 1st century A.D. Rome. Students will continue to build their English vocabulary by making connections between English words and their Latin roots. They will explore the influence of the ancient Romans on modern culture through history, art and culture.

**Materials:** Students will use the Ecce Romani Units I and II textbook. Students are asked to be prepared in class with writing utensils and paper for notes and exercises. Students will also be asked to keep a notebook for this class. Online resources and Canvas will also be used as part of the course. Other materials needed for assignments during the year include: notebook, pencils, highlighters, colored pencils, colored pens. poster board and a school computer.

**Outline:** Students will study the following topics during the year.

- Vocabulary: Ecce Romani II Vocabulary Chapters XXIV-XLIV
- **English derivatives:** English words derived from the vocabulary, mottoes, phrases and abbreviations.
- Grammar: A review of nouns and their 6 cases, adjectives and agreement of adjectives, personal pronouns and the demonstratives hic and ille, review of the 6 tenses of the active verb. Relative clauses, passive verb forms, participles, positive, comparative and superlative degree of adjectives and adverbs, deponent verbs, subordinating clauses with the subjunctive, indirect statement.

• **Culture and History:** Roman life (Women, food, apartment living, education, the baths, the amphitheater, etc.), mythology and religion, historical overview (the end of the Republic, Augustus, the empire).

# **Classroom Expectations:**

- **Entering the classroom** students are expected to arrive on time and to engage in classroom routines.
