| Go outside, collect a leaf, and write a paragraph describing its texture, color, and shape. | Write a sentence about your favorite fall activity AND draw a picture of it | Create a picture using repeated addition or an array to solve a multiplication problem (e.g., 2 x 3). | Log on to your launch pad, click on Storyline and read a book. Choose a character to write about. |
| Count the number of syllables in each word (harvest, pumpkin, apple, leaf, Thanksgiving) | Go outside, collect leaves, and sort by color or shape. Create bar graphs or pictographs to show results. | Find a newspaper and find the following: words with 3 syllables, words with digraphs, words with r-controlled vowels and long vowels. | Find a sales magazine. Find 5 different ways you can spend \$100. |
| Skip count by 2s, 5s, and 10s to 100. | Choose small objects in your house (candy, beans or buttons). Make 5 arrays and discuss with a family member. | Practice writing your name in cursive using different writing tools. Ex. pencil, pen, or marker | Oraw an apple tree and label its parts (leaves, root, trunk, branches, fruit) |
| List 5 adjectives to describe fall. Write sentences for each (use different subjects for each sentence). | Ask 10 friends or family members to tell you their favorite fall activity, pet, or ice cream. Create a graph using the information. | Draw a pumpkin. Write a story about your pumpkin. Write your name in cursive at the end of your story | Calculate the total of 4 + 5 + 6 using your favorite snacks (e.g., pretzel, raisin, popcorn) |
| Find 5 cool FACTS about Fall. | Create a song to teach about a math skill you have learned. | Go outside, then write a short poem about fall weather. | O 5 big arm circles like a tree. |
