Dear Third Grade Families,

We believe that students should relax and have fun over the summer, along with maintaining the skills learned in 2nd grade! The third grade teachers look forward to embarking on an exciting journey through third grade with our new crew! We also need you to prepare for the adventures of third grade. In order to be ready for the journey, you will need to complete the following summer assignments by the first day of school.

## READING ASSIGNMENTS

All students should read daily to build fluency, stamina, and comprehension. A fluency and basic reading comprehension assessment will be given at the beginning of the year. Students may read books from home, the public library, and from electronic resources such as MyOn. Read a variety of genres – poems, mysteries, biographies, etc. Students should talk about their reading with their parent or guardian. The goal is to read at least 360 minutes in June and 360 minutes in July. A reading log is provided and additional pages can be found on the school web page to assist you in tracking your progress.



## MATH ASSIGNMENTS

It is very important that students are fluent in addition and subtraction before entering third grade. This summer students should work on building fluency (automaticity) of the math facts. First in Math is a great online resource and can be found on Launchpad. First in Math has hundreds of games that focus on math standards in each grade level. You may also want to make flash cards too! Students will take an addition and subtraction fluency assessment during the first week of school.

Students should complete Math and Reading i-Ready lessons each week scoring at least an 80% or better on all parts of the lesson. Completing i-Ready lessons during the summer will help ensure that students do not forget crucial second grade skills. This will also better prepare students to be ready to learn third grade standards at the beginning of the school year. Please do not wait until time to return to school to work on iReady. Richmond County updates classes around the end of July.
