Enrollment Guidelines

Pre-K: Child must be four years old on or before September 1
Kindergarten: Child must be five years old on or before September 1
First Grade: Child must be six years old on or before September 1



WHAT'S NEW?

- Middle and High School students have new math and english language arts textbooks this year.
- Our attendance policy will be enforced as written in the Code of Student Conduct and Discipline for excused and unexcused absences.
- We have updated our grading practices and have two semester grading periods during the school year. This year, your family will receive two progress reports during the semester followed by the report card at the end of the semester.
- The Code of Conduct of Student Discipline is being carefully reviewed with our students to reinforce the importance of school safety. Encourage your child to report any safety concerns to their teacher or school office. The school system TipLine is available at 706-828-1077.
- For the 2022-2023 school year, Richmond County School System students in eligible schools will receive free lunch through the Community Eligibility Provision. Families with children attending Davidson Fine Arts Magnet School, Freedom Park K-8 School, and C.T. Walker Magnet School are requested to complete the Free and Reduced Lunch Application.
- Two PowerUp Asynchronous Learning Days per semester.

CHECKLIST

You can make sure everyone is prepared and ready for the start of school by following the steps below.

- Enroll in and update your contact information in Parent Portal**
Reach out to your local school or visit www.rcboe.org/parentportal for support on signing up.
- Practice New Routines**
Practicing routines like getting up and getting dressed on time, eating on a regular schedule, evening work/ reading time and nighttime routines for rest help make sure your child is ready when school starts!
- Check School Start/End Times**
Our school start times have changed for the 2022-23 school year. Verify your school start time at rcboe.org/backtoschool.
- Find Your Bus Stop**
We have updated bus routes. Check to verify your bus stop location during open house or online at rcboe.info/FindYourBusStop.

We are installing Centegix CrisisAlert systems in all our schools to make it easy for our staff to secure our buildings and to call for help when they need it.

TRANSPORTATION

DEVICE CARE

1

GENERAL TIPS FOR YOUR DEVICE

The device should be stored in its case. Never pile things on top because damage may occur. Only use a lint-free microfiber or soft cotton cloth to clean your computer screen.

CARE IN THE CLASSROOM

Always follow directions given by your teacher about using your device. Keep the device in the center of the desk - not on the edge. Secure the device before standing up.

CARE AT HOME

Keep your device and charging cord away from pets, extreme heat or cold, food, drinks and small children. Designate a safe location where your device can be stored and charged.

4

USING YOUR DEVICE RESPONSIBLY

Your device is intended for school work ONLY. Use of the device must be consistent with the educational objective of the Richmond County School System.

5

LOGIN INFORMATION SHOULD BE PROTECTED

Protect your username, password and personal information. You are responsible for all content found on your device.

6

AVOID INAPPROPRIATE OR UNSAFE CONTENT

Your device is school property and is being monitored. School personnel have the right to inspect it and your files or electronic communications at any time.

DEVICE COST & INSURANCE

- **Damage** = \$25 for Laptop; \$50 for iPad (cracked screen, jammed keys, etc.)
- **Lost or Stolen** = replacement cost unless optional insurance was purchased.
- **Charging Cable replacement** = \$49
- **Optional Insurance:** Available annually
 - Cost for laptop insurance** = \$15.99
 - Cost for iPad insurance** = \$8.64
 - Cost for Chromebook insurance** = \$8.82

Insurance covers theft/burglary/robbery, fire, power surge, vandalism, and natural disasters, but does not cover damage.
