Meetings are held each year to review the compact and make changes based on the student needs.

Effective compact:

- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skill using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom


Parents/family are welcome to provide feedback on the compact anytime during the school year. This information will be collected and used during the annual revision meeting with parents/family.

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

Richmond County Schools Goals:

Goal 1:

During the 2022-2023 school year, we will utilize technology and the Richmond County School System Instructional Framework to increase academic achievement across all tested content areas by 3%.

Goal 2:

During the 2022-2023 school year, through our Induction Support Program we will increase the percentage of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in Richmond County School System by 3%.

Goal 3:

School Goals

Willis Foreman Elementary Goals:

- I. The number of students scoring Developing on the Reading GMAS will increase by 20%, the number of students scoring Proficient will increase by 10 %, and the number of students scoring Distinguished will increase by 10% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- II. The number of students scoring Developing on the Math Portion of GMAS will increase by 20%, the number of students scoring Proficient will increase by 10 %, and the number of students scoring Distinguished will increase by 10% as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- III. School-wide student Office Discipline Referrals will decrease by 50%, as measured by SWSS data and Infinite Campus data.

Willis Foreman Elementary Focus Area: Reading and Math

Our school will strive to meet the goals in reading and math through consistent and rigorous instruction.

School Responsibilities:

Willis Foreman Elementary will:

- Provide families with a leveled book and reading response activity to complete with students at home
- Provide addition and subtraction strategies for families to work with students at home
- Provide families with math methods resources and examples through web access to assist completion of student's math homework.
- Provide families with information about school wide events to learn academic strategies to practice at home.

Student Responsibilities:

- Listen and follow directions routinely.
- Discuss with my parents what I'm learning in school.
- Share information and signed papers with teachers.
- Ask for help when I do not understand.
- Read at home daily.
- Bring materials to school.
- Obey the students' rules and take pride in my school and community.

At Home

WFES families joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families will:

- Assist my child with his/her homework daily in a regular place at home with appropriate school supplies.
- Read the Wordly Wildcat school newsletter and utilize resources provided
- Read to and with their child and complete the provided reading response activity.
- Practice & discuss provided math strategies with their child.
- Read and follow provided math methods resources and examples to follow standards.
- Attend school wide events to learn academic strategies to utilize at home.
