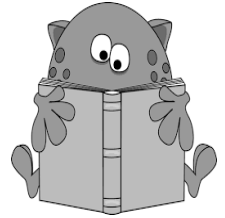
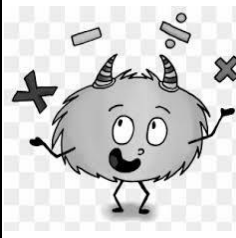
- Monday, October 25 – **Cool Monday - I'm too COOL For drugs! - Wear your favorite sunglasses.**

Bullying is when someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they keep doing it even when you tell them to stop or show them that you're upset. Listed below are some types of bullying:

- **Physical:** Hitting, kicking, slapping, pinching, spitting, tripping; stealing or destroying someone's possessions; making mean or rude hand gestures
- **Verbal:** Name calling, insults, teasing, intimidation, taunting
- **Social:** Lying and spreading rumors; leaving someone out on purpose; telling others not to be friends with someone; embarrassing someone in public
- **Cyber:** Making online threats, intimidating others online or using their log-in; spreading rumors online; posting hurtful texts, emails, or videos
