

We recognize that good attendance is essential to academic success. This school year, we invite families to help their child(ren) build a habit of regular attendance. Regular attendance is vital for students to gain the academic and social skills they need to thrive. This year RCSS would like to emphasize the importance attendance has on both daily assignments for students and state testing. Students who do not attend school on a regular basis struggle academically with daily assignments which impacts grades and graduation requirements. Daily academic struggles impact state standardized testing which allows our students, schools and the RCSS to prove academic effectiveness and achievement. McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Services for Families in Transition

The Richmond County School System supports students who experience homelessness through the McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth program. Our school system employs a homeless liaison and an outreach school social worker for people without housing to ensure that homeless children and youth have access to the educational and other services needed to meet the same academic achievement standards for all students

House Bill 251

RCSS Families may request a transfer to another public school within their local school district to specified schools and grades designated as having available space under a 2009 state law (OCGA 20-2-2131).

Each year, the school system identifies schools with available space and accepts applications from families. To request a zone exemption, families must apply between

November 1, 2023 - May 1, 2024.

Immunizations

To prevent the spread of vaccine-preventable diseases, all students must have an up-to-date GA Form 3231 Certificate of Immunization on file at school. New students must present this form to enroll. The immunization form can be acquired from the Georgia Department of Public Health along with any vaccinations that the your child(ren) may need for a reasonable price.

Kindergarten is another great opportunity for students to attend a full day of school and develop the early social and academic skills to be successful in the first grade. Our kindergarten program is open to students who turn five years old on or before September 1. A child, who has lived in another state for at least two years before moving to Georgia and was legally enrolled in a public kindergarten or first grade in that state, may enroll in a Georgia public school kindergarten or first grade, provided the child will be five for kindergarten and six for first grade by **December 31**.

Parent Portal

The Infinite Campus Parent Portal allows you to register your child for school, update your contact information, and review your child's schedule, attendance, and report card. Parents and guardians can share one account or create individual ones. Once the account is established, it follows the student through graduation.

Pre-K Program

Our Pre-K program is a full-day program that provides students with the early social and academic skills that help them learn to play and communicate with their peers. Students that are four years old by September 1, 2023, are eligible for the 2023-2024 school year. Applications for the 2024-2025 Pre-K lottery will open on

March 1 and close on April 15. Notification of a slot will be emailed to the address on the application.

Nutrition

Our belief in Richmond County School System is that a hungry child is unable to perform their best academically. To help all children succeed, breakfast and lunch options are served daily in all schools. Breakfast and Lunch Menus are posted monthly on the district website along with nutrition information. Students can pay with cash or parents/guardians can purchase meals through their MySchoolBucks account. However, some schools may participate in the free lunch program which means meals are served at no cost to families.

Testing Calendars

Standardized Testing Dates

iReady: The iReady diagnostic is administered in grades K-8 in English Language Arts and Mathematics three times during the school year to gather detailed information on what skills students are likely to have mastered and skills that need growth.

Fall: August 28 - September 15;

Winter: January 8-26; Spring: April 22 - May 10

NWEA Map: The NWEA Map diagnostic is administered in grades 9-12. It is a computer adaptive test designed to measure student growth and achievement levels in English Language Arts and Mathematics. The diagnostic measures what students know and what they are ready to learn next.

Fall: August 28 - September 15;

Winter: January 8-26; Spring: May 3 - May 10

Content Mastery Assessments (CMAs): The Content Mastery Assessments are administered three times during the school year for students in grades 3-12. These assessments are to provide an overview of student mastery of standards being taught in the classroom.

CMA #1 September 25 - October 6; CMA #2 December 4-15; CMA #3 February 26 - March 15

PowerUp Asynchronous Learning Days

There are four dedicated PowerUp Asynchronous Learning Days in the 2023-2024 school year. On these days, students are provided with 1:1 technology to explore digital learning. Schools will send instructions prior to these learning days about assignments and activities for students to complete.


PowerUp Technology

This is the second academic year that all students in our school system will have access to a technology device such as Chromebooks and iPads. Technology is changing how students engage with instructors and resources to support instruction. Additionally, teachers are able to personalize assignments to address the needs of the student. Parents should complete the PowerUp for Parents Course to support their child(ren) in the responsible use of their device. The cost for optional insurance is \$29 and can be paid at **SchoolDeviceCoverage.com** If insurance is not purchased, parents will be responsible for the full cost of repairs and/or damage the device may incur.


