Title I is the largest federally funded education program that provides extra support to students who are academically at-risk in public and private schools. Through Title 1, government allocates funds to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district. Title I funds are designed to help close the achievement gap between disadvantaged students and their peers. Title I is to help ensure that all children have the opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on challenging state academic standards and assessments.

I, as a student, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the State's high standards by:

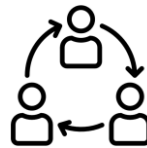
- Engage in opportunities for learning in the classroom and with school support staff to increase social emotional wellbeing
