



HES Storybook Pumpkin Contest

Dear Parents,

The HES Library is sponsoring a Storybook Pumpkin Contest for any students who would like to enter. At home, students decorate a pumpkin as their favorite book character, and bring the decorated pumpkin to the library on **Monday, October 30th between the hours of 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.** The pumpkins will be judged on Tuesday, October 31st and displayed for viewing on Wednesday, November 1st from 7:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. Winners will be announced on Wednesday, November 1st.

Literary Pumpkin Contest Rules

1. The theme of the pumpkin decorating is "My Favorite Storybook Character."
2. Pumpkins may be painted or drawn or colored with magic markers, but **NOT carved**. Acrylic paints or permanent markers work best. Watercolors tend to run. Yarn, pipe cleaners, fabric scraps, cardboard, glitter, construction paper, etc. may be used to decorate the pumpkin. Paste or glue may also be used.
3. **CARVED and OVER RIPE pumpkins will NOT be accepted.**
4. There may be only ONE (1) entry per student.
5. Each entry should be clearly identified with an attached card including the following information:
Side 1 – student's name, grade, class, and room number
Side 2 – storybook character, book from which the character is found, and a brief statement telling about your pumpkin character (i.e., why you chose this character, what you like about your character, etc.)
6. **Entries are due on Monday, October 30th.** Please bring them to the library. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. Criteria will be originality, creativity, and relevance to the book, and the decisions of the judges are final.
7. There will be a Certificate of Participation awarded to each student.
8. **Pumpkins must be picked up on Thursday, November 2nd by 3:00 p.m.**
Pumpkins not picked up by the above date and time will be discarded.
9. Participation is totally voluntary and should be done on the student's own time.
