Georgia Scholar

Georgia Scholars is one of the highest honors in the state. Seniors can apply if they meet all eight criteria.

- 1. Earn at least 22 credits for graduation.
- 2. Earn a 1360 SAT or 31 ACT (cannot super score)
- 3. Non weighted GPA of 3.7
- 4. Registered to vote if 18 by March 1.
- 5. Letter of reference as evidence to show self esteem and concern for others.
- 6. Participated in at least 3 different competitive interscholastic activities
- 7. Appointed by school official/ elected to positions of leadership in two different school organizations
- 8. Shown evidence of leadership in two different organization outside of the school
