Welcome Parents, School Staff, and Community Members

Jamestown Elementary receives money from Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, most recently reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act. This law provides federal funds through the Georgia Department of Education to school systems based on high numbers or percentages of children who meet certain financial criteria. These funds are provided to help ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to succeed in school by meeting the challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards."

Purpose of Meeting

"The federal law requires that each school system receiving "Title I, Part A funds" jointly develop with parents and stakeholders of all participating children. Assistance is requested in planning our family engagement activities and specifically in revising district and school policies, School Improvement Plan, School-Parent Compact, Building Staff Capacity (determining what training our staff needs to promote good school-family partnerships, and determining how best to spend our family engagement funds).



What is Title I?

Jamestown Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I program must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and members a written parent and family engagement policy.

What is it?

In the Fall of the year, the revised plan is sent home with each student, given at Open House, Title 1 Annual Meeting and parent conferences. The plan is available on the school's website, in the office. Parents can also obtain a copy from the Parent Resource Center.

TITLE I FUNDS

Title I Parent and Family Engagement Set Aside:

Each district receiving more than \$500,000 in Title I Part A Funds is required to reserve **at least one percent** of its Title I funds to carry out parent and family engagement activities, including those described in the written policy section below. **Ninety (90) percent** of these "setaside" funds must be distributed to schools, with priority given to "high-need" schools. The law further requires that parents and family members of students **must** be included in decisions regarding how these engagement funds are spent.

School Improvement Plan

Jamestown Elementary Annually evaluates the schoolwide plan using data from the State's assessments, other student performance data, and perception data to determine if the schoolwide program has been effective in addressing the major problem areas and, in turn, increasing student achievement, particularly for the lowestachieving students. Schools must annually revise the plan, as necessary, based on student needs and the results of the evaluation to ensure continuous improvement. (ESEA section 1114(b)(3); 34 C.F.R. § 200.26(c)).



School Improvement Plan Input

School Goals:

#1: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, students performing on or above grade level in reading will increase by 5% in grades K-5 from 39% (134 students) to 44% (151 students) as measured by i-Ready Reading and from 12% (20 students) to 17% (28 students) in grade 3-5 as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment resulting from high quality tier 1 instruction.

#2: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, students performing on or above grade level in math will increase by 5% in grades K-5 from 27% (93 students) to 32% (110 students) as measured by i-Ready and a 5% increase in math in grade 3-5 as measured by the Georgia Milestones Assessment

#3: By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, Jamestown will continue to build a supportive learning environment that integrates social, emotional, and academic support to increase student attendance by 3%, reduce student discipline referrals by 50%, and increase the number of students who feel safe in self- monitored non-instructional areas by 25% on the Student Health Survey.
