The Stimson Doctrine

- began w/ Hoover, cont'd with FDR
- What it said?
- targeted Japan directly and all aggressors indirectly
- violated Open Door Policy, Nine Power Treaty, and Kellogg Briand Pact
- U.S. \$86m aid to China

- Germany and Russia sign a Non-Aggression Pact
- Germany invades Poland Sept 1, 1939, blitzkrieg begins
- France falls summer 1940
- Aerial bombing of England begins

 - public opinion divided
 - anti-war group incl Lindbergh, Hoover

7. Fall 1941

- U.S. and Japanese diplomats try to work out problems over China
- U.S. trade embargo vs. Japan gas, steel, tools
- rejected Japanese demands to end the embargo b/c of Open Door violations
- Emperor Hirohito gives Japanese diplomats until late Nov to work out problems
- Attack Dec 7, 1941 Pearl Harbor
- FDR "day that will live in infamy"
- J fear of "awakening a sleeping giant"
- all in Cong but 1 vote for war

The Manhattan Project 1939

- letter from Einstein to Roosevelt possibility of splitting uranium atom release of energy
- J. Robert Oppenheimer
- Secrecy lab in Los Alamos, NM also worked in New York, Chicago, Texas
- \$2 billion thousands of scientists, little contact betw cities

Death of FDR April 1945 –

Harry Truman becomes POTUS – informed of Manhattan Project – makes fateful decision to end the war quickly

- "Little Boy" Aug 6, 1945 on Hiroshima –100,000 dead + 100,000 affected
- "Fat Man" Aug 9 Nagasaki 70,000
- Emperor Hirohito orders surrender Sept. 2
