- \_\_\_1. mass produced houses, responsible for the growth of the suburbs in the 1950s
- \_\_\_2. an outgrowth of auto expansion, also had a military purpose behind it
- \_\_\_3. artistic movement which demonstrated the rebellious side of the 1950s
- \_\_\_4. President Eisenhower warned of this growing influence of this in his Farewell Address
- \_\_\_5. trend from 1946-1964 which transformed the American economy and American families
- \_\_\_6. also known as the Serviceman's Readjustment Act, this was an economic aid program for returning WWII veterans
- \_\_\_7. military alliance to rival NATO which consisted communist bloc satellite nations in Eastern Europe under the control of the Soviet Union
- \_\_\_8. lasted 381 days, successful because of its economic effects, showed the power of the emerging civil rights movement
- \_\_\_9. Eisenhower's Secretary of State who advocated a strong stance against the Soviet Union in the Cold War by threatening massive retaliation in the escalating arms race
- \_\_\_10. this person's actions began the Montgomery Bus Boycott
- \_\_\_11. emerged as the reluctant leader of the Civil Rights Movement in Montgomery in the mid-1950s
- \_\_\_12. the belief that if one nation in Southeast Asia fell to communism the others would quickly fall, this was the reason troops were sent into Vietnam initially
- \_\_\_13. falsely accused hundreds of people in the U.S. government of being communists in the 1950s
- \_\_\_14. scientists who sold atomic bomb secrets to the Russians after World War II
- \_\_\_15. communism came here in the late 1940s after a brutal Civil War
- \_\_\_16. the United States sent troops here in the early 1950s to prevent the spread of communism
- \_\_\_17. economic aid package to rebuild Europe and promote democratic ideals after World War II
- \_\_\_18. Congressional group which investigated millions of Americans for suspected ties to communist organizations
- \_\_\_19. U.S. post-World War II policy to prevent the spread of communism in Europe and Asia
- \_\_\_20. to assist "free peoples" in resisting "unwanted pressures", this announcement brought \$400 million in aid to Greece and Turkey to help them resist communist influences from Russia
