- ___ 1. military philosophy emphasized during the Kennedy administration that U.S. troops must have multiple options in the event of a crisis
- ___ 2. the first African-American student to attend the University of Mississippi
- ___ 3. major North Vietnamese attack on all South Vietnamese cities on New Year, resulted in widespread war protests in the United States
- ___ 4. the 'iron curtain' became real in August 1961 when Germany was split into two countries by this
- ___ 5. begun by John F. Kennedy, this seen as a way to fight the Cold War by assisting Third World countries through American volunteerism
- ___ 6. this was the name of Kennedy's domestic agenda
- ___ 7. Southern Democrat Governor of Alabama who stood up to the Kennedy administration's attempt to desegregate the University of Alabama
- ___ 8. part of the "new left" – this was a radical activist organization involved in antiwar and anti-government protesting
- ___ 9. book credited with stimulating the modern environmental movement in the United States
- ___ 10. book which revealed that poverty in the United States was worse than many realized
- ___ 11. the National Organization of Women was co-founded by the author of this book
- ___ 12. location of the failed invasion of Cuba in 1961
- ___ 13. law which ended literacy testing as a qualification for suffrage
- ___ 14. led by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, their report was the official record of the assassination of President Kennedy
- ___ 15. Term which implies an easing or improving of relations between the U.S. and Soviet Union in the early 1970s
- ___ 16. Declaration by Congress in 1964 giving President Johnson a "blank check" to do whatever was necessary to protect U.S. troops in Vietnam, led to the rapid escalation of the war
- ___ 17. Law which reinforced the Brown decision and ended racial discrimination in all public accommodations and in the workplace
- ___ 18. Term for U.S. troops who went to Vietnam beginning around 1961 to train the South Vietnamese in their efforts to resist communist pressures from North Vietnam
- ___ 19. This was the mostly unsuccessful program during the Kennedy administration to improve relations between the U.S. and Latin America
- ___ 20. Their report on race relations in America revealed that the U.S. was moving toward becoming two 'separate but unequal' societies
- ___ 21. This was the term for Lyndon Johnson's domestic agenda which included a War on Poverty
