Each person is responsible for turning in a report unless I tell you to turn it in as a group. No two lab reports should be identical. Due date for each report will be given at the beginning of the lab.

Make-up Assignments:

Any time you miss any part of class, you are responsible for getting assignments and notes. I will work with you to develop a make-up plan within a 5-day window.
