<u>Notebooks</u> are very important in this class and should be kept organized. It will serve as your portfolio. Each entry or item in the notebook will be assigned a number.

<u>Lab</u> grade will be determined from the lab report and from participation in the lab. You must clean up your lab station when you finish your lab. Points will be deducted for not doing so. Each person is responsible for turning in a report. No two lab reports should be identical. Due date for each report will be given at the beginning of the lab.

Make-up Assignments:

Any time you miss any part of class, you are responsible for getting assignments and notes. You must have a written excuse to be able to make up assignments. You have 2 days after your absence you bring the excuse. You must schedule a time to make up work THE DAY YOU RETURN FROM YOUR ABSENCE. If you miss a lab, you must schedule a time with me to complete it. If you miss a test, you will be expected to take the test on the day that you return unless you make other arrangements with me. Late assignments will be accepted for one week. After one week, an alternate assignment (covering the same standards) *may* be given. The student and the teacher will determine the due date for the alternate assignment.

Students will be allowed to re-take assessments upon request as long they have attended at least one tutoring or help session, within the time period agreed upon by the student and teacher.
