What is it?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. **Meadowbrook Elementary** will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Facilitator office and front office.

2023-2024 District Goals

Math -MES will implement R.O.P.E.S math strategy to increase the percentage of students scoring at Proficient learner or above on the math GMAS from 8.26% to 13% by the end of 2024 school year,
