### Jointly Developed

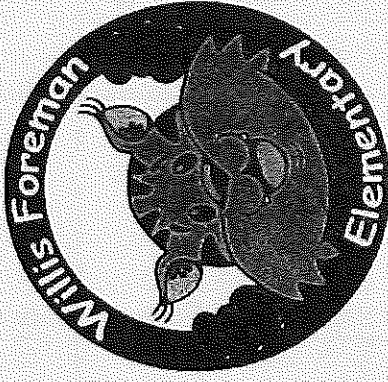
