




Decision Triangle - Balance

- If a district wants Small Schools and Low Operating Costs, it is difficult to offer Robust Program Offering.
- If a district wants Robust Program
 offerings with Small School sizes, it is
 difficult to have Low Operating Costs.

- 16 out of 28 elementary schools are currently below the 450 enrollment needed for minimum program State funding
- 6 out of 8 middle schools are currently below the 640 enrollment needed for minimum program State funding
- 4 out of 8 high schools are currently below the 970 enrollment needed for minimum program State funding

- New Belair MS is fed 100% from Belair ES and Reynolds ES







- Once complete, Tutt MS students will move to the new Langford MS





 - Deer Chase ES and Hephzibah ES feed 100% to Hephzibah MS




