#### Academic Yearly Overview

- In first grade, students will use individualized learning stations to master all academic content standards.
- Math numbers 0-120, counting, time, addition, subtraction, and place value.
- Reading/Language Arts Fundations Phonics, High Frequency Sight Words or Trick Words, story retell, oral reading fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.
- Writing progressing from writing sentences to paragraphs, fundamentals of a narrative, informational, and opinion writing compositions.
- Science weather & seasons, water, sound, lights & shadows, magnets, plants & animals
- Social Studies the contributions and positive character traits of historical figures and geography

#### Behavior Policy / Homework

All 1<sup>st</sup> grade teachers will follow the same 7 Step Policy.

This will be the basis for your child's conduct grade. Conduct and homework does count toward a grade this year!

#### 7 Step Policy

- 1. Nonverbal Warning eye contact, ect...
- 2. Verbal Warning
- 3. Close proximity to teacher
- 4. Redirect behavior & a note home
- 5. Time out IN classroom
- 6. Time out OUT of classroom
- 7. Office Referral
