### WHAT IS A LEXILE MEASURE?

Matching Readers with Text

The Lexile Framework assesses both sides of reading development—
the reader and the material being read.



#### **ACCORDING TO...**



Text Complexity

A Lexile is a standard score developed by MetaMetrics

• Matches a student's reading ability with difficulty of text material

Interpreted as the level of book that a student can read with 75% comprehension

The Lexile level will always be shown as a number with an "L" after it.

#### 770L = 770 LEXILE

The higher the Lexile measure, the higher the student's reading level.

Intervals of five with 5L being the lowest.

The highest possible measure is 2000L.

•Anything below 5L is assessed as a BR (Beginning Reader).




FIGURE 2: Forecasted comprehension of books with various Lexile measures Lexile Reader Measure Lexile Text Measure Forecasted Comprehension Rate 1500L 1250L 1000L 1000L 750L 500L

#### **LEXILES: THE "SWEET SPOT"**

Where reading comprehension should be at roughly 75% without frustration



For a student with a Lexile Measure of:

850L 50 points above = 900L 100 points below = 750L \*Sweet Spot = 750L - 900L



#### **LEXILE BANDS**

<b>Grade Band</b>	"Stretch" Lexile Band
K-1	N/A
2-3	420L-820L
4-5	740L-1010L
6-8	925L-1185L
9-10	1050L-1335L
11-CCR	1185L-1385L

These "stretch" Lexile bands are the basis for determining at what text complexity level students should be reading—and at which grades—to make sure they are ultimately prepared for the reading demands of college and careers.

### **LEXILE: GATEWAY**



3rd grade students = 520 or above

must pass Reading Lexile component under the Language Arts section of test

5th grade students = 830 or above

must pass the Reading Lexile component under the Language Arts section of test

- Building reading lists




#### HELPING STRUGGLING READERS

- Level the comprehension playing field with "just right" books
- Solicit "at home" support from your parents
  - Show parents Lexile tools online
- Allow students to select text
- High-Low Books and Graphic Novels
  - High interest
  - Low readability



- Software program that evaluates the reading demand—or readability—of books, articles and other materials
- Free for registered users
- Find level teacher created material
  - ✓ save material as a text file
  - ✓ log in to the Lexile Analyzer (free registration)
  - ✓ submits file
  - ✓ receive a Lexile measure



STRATEGIES:
Using Lexile levels in the classroom



Develop individualized reading lists

- Enhance thematic teaching
  - \*Build a bank of titles at varying Lexile levels

- Develop a reading folder
  - ❖Individualized (returned for weekly review)
  - \* The folder can contain
    - ✓ a reading list of books within the student's Lexile range
    - ✓ reports of recent assessments
    - ✓ a parent form to record reading that occurs at home.



• Choose texts lower in the student's Lexile range when factors make the reading situation more challenging, threatening or unfamiliar.

• Select texts at or above the student's range to stimulate growth when a topic is of extreme interest to the student, or when you will be adding additional support such as background teaching or discussion. Use the free Lexile Book Database (at www.Lexile.com)

  - >to support book selection and
  - > create booklists within a student's Lexile range

- Use the free Lexile calculator (at www.Lexile.com)
  - ➤ to gauge expected reading comprehension at different Lexile measures for readers and texts.

#### This research still stands.....

Student "A" reads 20 minutes each day

3600 minutes in a school year

Student "B" reads 5 minutes each day

900 minutes in a school year

Student "C" reads 1 minute each day

180 minutes in a school year

1,800,000 words



90th percentile





50th percentile

8,000 words



10th percentile

By the end of 6<sup>th</sup> grade Student "A" will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Student "B" will have read only 12 school days. Which student would you expect to have a better vocabulary? Which student would you expect to be more successful in school...and in life?
