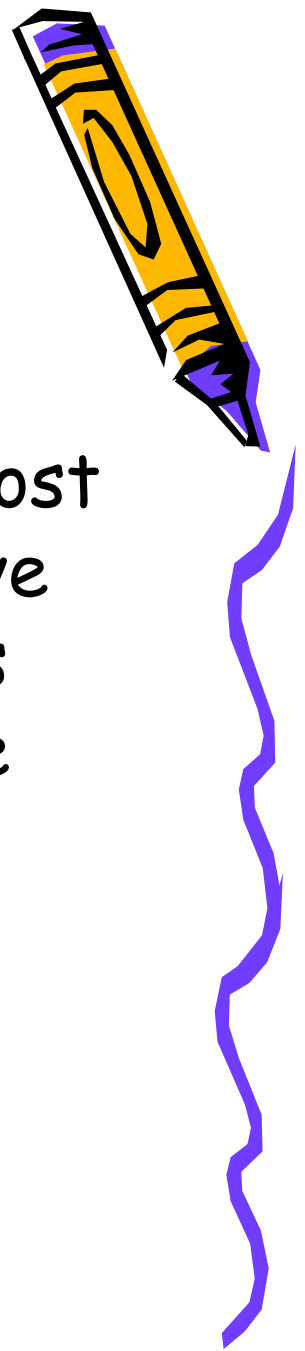


# Sixth Grade Science Lab Safety Rules

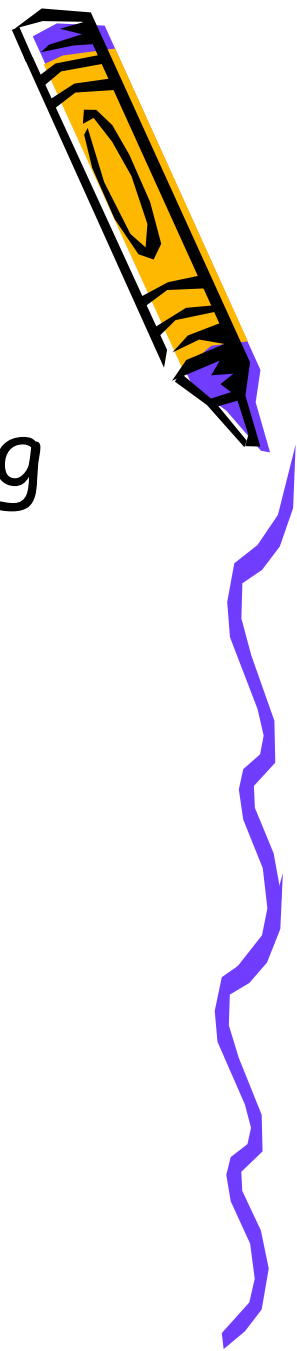

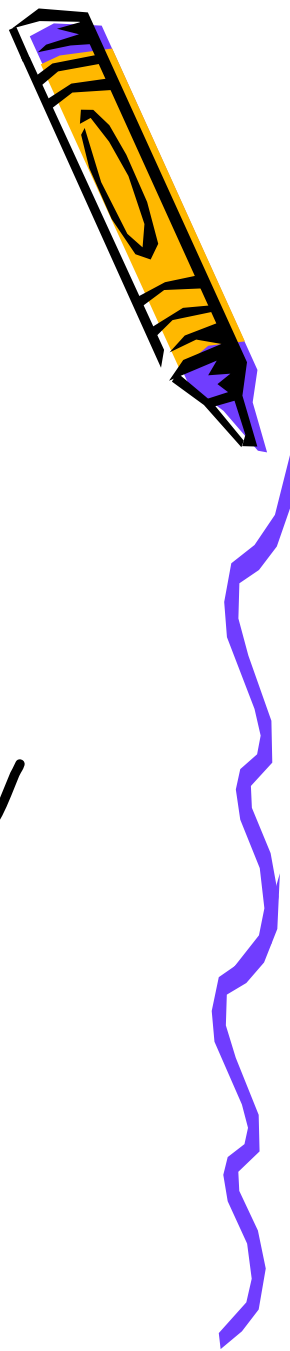
# DRESS CODE

- Push up loose sleeves.

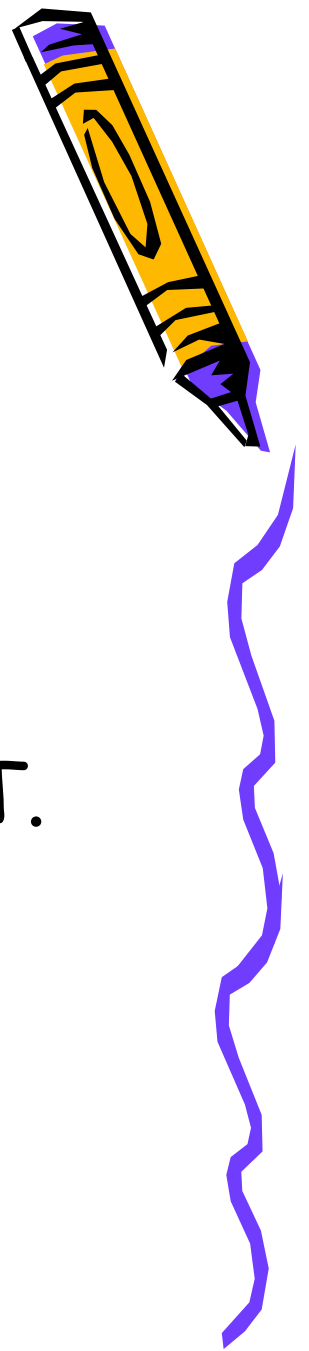


# LAB BEHAVIOR

- Wear lab aprons and goggles when instructed.

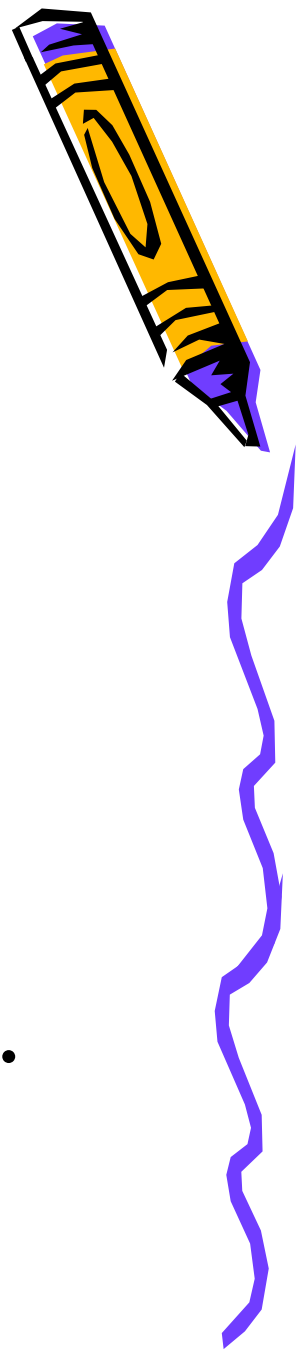


# SAFETY DURING THE LAB CONT.

- Tell the teacher if glassware is chipped or broken.

- Straighten up all equipment.

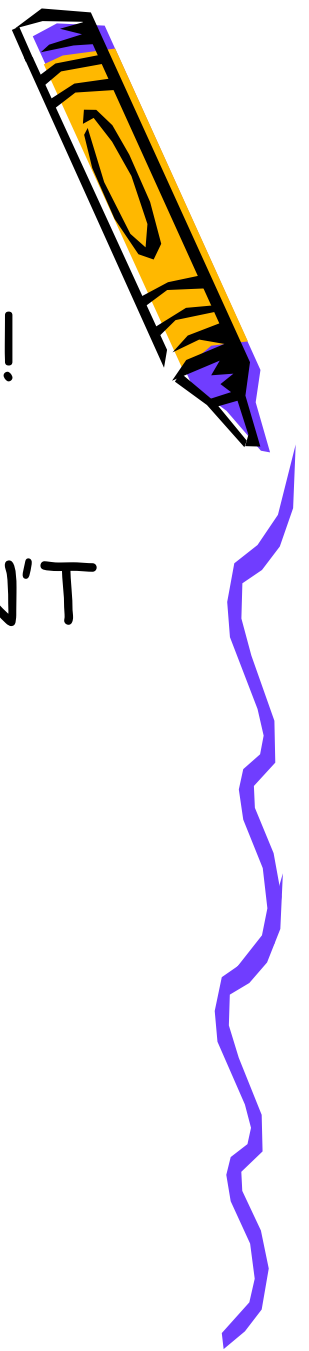


# Lab Grades
