

**IB CLASSES** 



- All IB Projects (9th Grade Capstone, 10th Grade Capstone, Extended Essays and Reflective Projects) are started and running. These
  projects are intended to be worked on individually, but may have graded components in certain classes such as PPS, TOK, AP World
  History or Scientific Research. This is what students should be working on to move towards the completion of these projects.
  - 9th Grade IB Students- 9th Grade students should use the break as an opportunity to start their primary research into the community and start working on their Community Outreach Proposal. Students are expected to reach out to community members to gather data to support their projects. For example, if a student is planning to organize a toy drive to benefit the Children's Hospital of Georgia they should reach out to the Children's Hospital of Georgia or see if they can get in contact with former patients to collect information on their experiences. There is information on the Community Outreach Proposal on the 9th Grade IB Students Page that students can reference as they prepare this assignment.
  - 10th Grade IB Students- 10th grade students should be working on completing their Learning Plan Proposals. Students are to be researching how to best learn their chosen skill and developing a plan for learning that skill. In January students will meet with their assigned supervisors (coming soon) to discuss these plan and adjust if needed. Students will be expected to present their proposals to their supervisors professionally---we are utilizing this as an opportunity to practice public speaking skills.
  - Reflective Projects (11th Graders)- Students may begin working on collecting research for their Reflective Projects. By the end of February they will have 10 sources collected into an Annotated Works Cited Page. Students will be finding sources on Galileo, reading through them and writing summaries of these sources for their Annotated Works Cited Page's. It would be a great idea for students to begin searching Galileo for their sources and start reading and annotating these sources.
  - Extended Essay (11th graders)- Students are working on developing a quality research question for their Extended Essay. All students should have a supervisor at this point they can consult with as they are developing their research question. Students will draft their first attempt at a research question when return from break then meet with their supervisors for feedback midway through January. Final research questions will be submitted to Canvas by the end of January. If students finish drafting their research questions it is highly encouraged for them to start collecting research on Galileo. The researching process can be extensive---it is encouraged for students to start as early as possible.
  - **Reflective Projects (12th Graders)-** Revised Rough Drafts of the Reflective Projects are due before students leave for break. Students will submit their final drafts of their Reflective Projects on February 20th, then meet with their supervisors a final time before February 27th to complete their Viva Voce reflection.
  - Extended Essay (12th Graders)- Final Drafts of the Extended Essay are due before we leave for break. Students will meet with their supervisors one final time in January to complete their Viva Voce reflection after Supervisors have graded Extended Essays and provided feedback. In January all 12th grade Extended Essay students must have their final draft of their Extended Essay complete as well as all three reflections in Managebac.

- IB Literature Year 2 HL: Essay due January 12th.
- IB Biology Year 2: IB Biology students had a 100% submission rate by the deadline for their IA drafts. Feedback will be provided after Christmas break and students will have the month of January to edit and revise before submitting their final drafts Feb. 16th. The IA will be graded & moderated by IB examiners and then factored into the final IB Score for Biology, along with the May Exams. Please encourage your senior to take their feedback and apply it to their revisions as they prepare to submit the final draft of their Internal Assessments. We will be working on Group 4 Projects 2nd Semester, which is a cumulative interdisciplinary project. More info to come as we move into Group 4 work.

### IB SPOTLIGHT/

### **DP DIPLOMA**

24 Points

- Completed assessments: CAS (Community, Action, Service), Extended Essay, and TOK.
- Each student takes at least three (but not more than four) subjects at higher level (HL), and the remaining at standard level (SL).

How do you earn points?

- IB classes are graded on a 1-7 scale (4-7 is considered an acceptable score)
- Each class grade is generated from two types of assessment components
  - Internal Assessments (IA) graded by the teacher with samples sent to IB for moderation, occurs during the school year
  - External Assessments (EA) graded by IB examiners, essays and exams, occurs in May

An Example with IB English Lit HL...

IA: Individual Oral Commentary (IOC): 15%

Individual Oral Presentation (IOP): 15%

EA: Written Assignment: 25%

Paper 1: 20% Paper 2: 25%

- · Each component is scored separately
- Total number of points earned is converted to the 1-7 scale

#### Please note:

- No grade of N or E (non-submittal or failing)
- No grade of 1
- No more than two grades of 2
- No more than three grades of 3

### **CP DIPLOMA**



# To earn a diploma in the CP, a student must

- Earn a score of 3 or higher in at least 2
   IB classes
- Pass the Reflective Project
- Complete Language development
- Complete Service Learning
- Take the third-party assessment for the pathway (e.g. ServSafe for culinary, CompTIA Security+ for cybersecurity)
- · At least 12 total points earned in HL classes
- · At least 9 total points earned in SL classes
- No penalty for academic misconduct from IB Final Award Committee
- Students have three (3) examination sessions in which to satisfy the requirements – students CAN retest!
