The reflective project promotes the development of research, writing, and extended communication skills, intellectual discovery and creativity. In particular, the theme of applied ethics in the personal and professional skills course directly supports the students in understanding and determining key concepts for their reflective project. The reflective project focuses on an ethical dilemma of an issue directly linked to the student's career-related study.

- o Essay (3000 words) or (1500-2000 words) and one of the following:
- Dialogue/Short Play (7 minutes)
- Short Film (7 minutes)
- Radio Play/Interview (7 minutes)
- Storyboard/Photographic presentation (7 minutes)

In addition to a written essay students keep a record of their reflections on the process of undertaking and completing the reflective project using the Reflections on planning and progress form (RPPF). This record

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IB DP Diploma Worksheet

Attached to the back of this newsletter is a worksheet for your child to navigate getting an IB Diploma for our juniors and seniors. You will see where they should list their SL (standard level) courses and their HL (high level) courses. They should then make some predictions, perhaps with some teacher input, about what those scores might be. A couple of important notes: IAs (those are the in-class assessments) go into those scores. They are not simply limited to the exams at the end of the year. Many of those assessments provide students with an opportunity to make a correction based on teacher guidance and resubmit. What a fabulous opportunity to increase those scores! Additionally, if a student is on the borderline between two scores, we encourage them to work with the teacher to find out what it takes to get on the upper end of that score. Please pay attention to the notes at the bottom as far as what scores are acceptable. Most importantly, students get **THREE TRIES** per test, so if the score is not acceptable to the student, we encourage the student to do some work and schedule a retest!
