## WOMEN IN DEFENSE AUGUSTA CHAPTER (WID AC) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The **2021 Grace Brewster Murray Hopper Scholarship** of \$500 will be awarded to qualifying female high school seniors who have exemplified skills in applying the sciences, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics to areas of national security. Applicants must submit the completed application with all required information no later than 11:59 P.M. EST on THURSDAY 24 MARCH 2022.

Applicants must meet the following criteria to qualify for the scholarship:

- Be a female student residing in Aiken, Columbia, or Richmond counties in the Central Savannah River Area (CSRA) of South Carolina or Georgia in the United States
- Be a high school senior

- Demonstrate a minimum grade point average of 3.0 by submitting a current transcript from an accredited and accepted educational institution
- Demonstrate financial need
- Completely fill out and submit the WID AC 2021 Scholarship Application
