
Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader™ is a computerized supplementary reading program that provides guided reading instruction to students in grades K −12. It aims to improve students' reading skills through reading practice and by providing frequent feedback on students' progress to teachers.

The Accelerated Reader™ program requires students to select and read a book based on their area of interest and reading level. Upon completion of a book, students take a computerized quiz based on the book's content and vocabulary. Quiz performance allows teachers to monitor student progress and to identify students who may need additional reading assistance. https://archive.org/details/ERIC_ED566522/page/n1

Students can take tests on short stories and novels they read in their language arts classes and on books in which they are interested. To find out whether the book you wish to take a test on is an AR book, simply go to ARbookfind.com at https://www.arbookfind.com/default.aspx


When students reach 150 AR points, they are invited to an AR Party. The AR Party will be on April 22, 2019. **Those who attend the party may win prizes!**

Academic Decathlon

The United States Academic Decathlon® is a ten-event scholastic competition for teams of high school students.

Each high school enters a team of nine students: 3 Honor students (3.750 - 4.00 GPA), 3 Scholastic students (3.00 - 3.749 GPA), and 3 Varsity students (0.00 - 2.999 GPA).

The overall 2019-2020 Academic Decathlon curricular theme is

In Sickness and in Health: An Exploration of

Illness and Wellness.

Following is some general information on the topics in each of the subject areas.

- SCIENCE: The science topic will be an introduction to the biology of cancer.
- LITERATURE: The literature curriculum will include critical reading, one long work of literature, and selected shorter works. The long work of literature will be the 1818 version of Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein*.
- ART: The art curriculum will include a section on art fundamentals and will largely focus on an exploration of illness and wellness in art.
- MUSIC: The music curriculum will introduce students to various musical works from across the centuries that will allow them to examine the role of mortality in Western art music.
- **SOCIAL SCIENCE:** The social science curriculum will introduce students to the history of healthcare.
- **ECONOMICS:** The economics curriculum will cover fundamental economic concepts, microeconomics, and macroeconomics and will also include a thematic section on health economics.
- MATHEMATICS: The mathematics curriculum will cover algebra and trigonometry.*

The full subject area outlines will be posted on the U.S. Academic Decathlon website on May 1 and will also be published in the U.S. Academic Decathlon Study Guide, which will begin shipping on May 15.

* The 2019–20 mathematics curriculum and materials will be the same as were used for the 2016–17 U.S. Academic Decathlon.


