Visual Arts :: Ceramics

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Course Objective ::

Ceramics introduces the characteristics of clay and design in clay by using various techniques of construction and decoration. It also emphasizes hand building and introduces other forming techniques, surface decoration and glaze applications. Styles of ceramic works from Western and non-Western cultures will be explored. The student engages in the creative process, finds and solves problems, and pursues open-ended inquiry through the production of artworks. The student develops aesthetic understanding through the examination of his or her art and the artwork of others. The student develops creativity, critical-thinking, and problem-solving skills. The student engages in aesthetic dialogue, making effort toward constructing meaning as he or she encounters and produces works of art based on Clay forming approaches.

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Class Expectations

- Instruction and demonstration will precede each project.
- Most projects require days to complete. While in the midst of a project, you will enter and begin work right away.
- All artwork will be stored on the ceramics shelves in the back of the art room so that we may select work to enter in various competitions throughout the school year.
- Your daily participation and proper clean up of workspace and tools are extremely important and part of your grade.
- All in-progress work will be stored in cubbies in the art room.

Supplies

- There is a \$20 fee for clay, which purchases 50 lbs. of clay, which will last through the school year. All students will
 need to use their own personal clay blocks this year to keep all student supplies separate. I will purchase everyone's clay
 once I have received the clay fee from each student.
- The deadline for turning in clay fee is August 31st so that our first project can begin the next week.

Make-up work

- It is your responsibility to check CANVAS to find and complete what you missed when you were absent.
- Projects will remain OPEN on CANVAS.
- If you have an excused absence, you will have ONE WEEK to submit your missing work without a late penalty (see the late work policy below). Make-up work turned in after one week will begin to incur the 3% penalty the first day after the one week period.

Late Work Policy

- Your work is counted as turned in on the date you turned it in on CANVAS. IF you are having trouble submitting on Canvas, you must tell me so that I can give you an ipad to submit from.
- Canvas will automatically deduct 3% from your grade for each day late it was turned in.
- Students who need additional time to complete projects must do so after school and not during class time.

Evaluation

1. All assignments must be turned in on CANVAS for grading by taking 3 photographs (2 different views & the bottom where your first name is written) and uploading into CANVAS under that assignment.

All assignments must be turned in for grading. All ceramic work must have your **FIRST NAME (not initials!)** and **CLASS PERIOD** on the bottom and be completed in time for firing.

Grade Weights:

Projects = 40% Quizzes & Writings (including Visual/Verbal Journals) = 35% Discussions & Critiques & Clean-up = 25%

- 2. Project grades will be based on the RUBRIC for that project and will be on the assignment page in CANVAS.
- 3. A final exam PROJECT will be given at the end of each semester and will count for 20% of your final grade.
- 4. Class critiques will be held at the conclusion of some projects.
- 5. Every student will be required to prepare and submit one of their artworks for exhibition and write an Artist Statement for the *Night of the Arts* art show in April. This will be a class work/project grade.

<u>Tutoring Hours</u>: After-school tutoring is offered weekly. Days and hours will be announced monthly beginning in September.
