READING ASSIGNMENTS

Students should complete 2 Reading i-Ready lessons each week scoring at least an 80% or better on all parts of the lesson. Completing i-Ready lessons during the summer will help ensure that students do not forget crucial second grade skills. This will also better prepare students to be ready to learn third grade standards at the beginning of the school year. Students should also read books and keep a log. Students may read books from home, the public library, and from electronic resources such as MyOn. Students must read at least 360 minutes in June and 360 minutes in July. A reading log is provided and additional pages can be found on the school web page.

MATH ASSIGNMENTS

Students should complete 2 Math i-Ready lessons each week scoring at least an 80% or better on all parts of the lesson. Completing i-Ready lessons during the summer will help ensure that students do not forget crucial second grade skills. This will also better prepare students to be ready to learn third grade standards at the beginning of the school year. First in Math is also a great online resource. First in Math has hundreds of games that focus on math standards in each grade level. Addition and subtraction fluency is a key component in third grade. In order for students to be as prepared as possible, we ask that you work on becoming fluent in addition and subtraction facts.
