- Implement a progress monitoring instrument and process for the effectiveness of instructional delivery and implementation of the schoolwide math instructional framework.

- By May 2026, Bayvale Elementary School will increase the percentage of students reading on grade level in grades 3–5 from an average of 30% (iR

### Stakeholder Engagement

#### Objectives

- By May 2026, increase family engagement by achieving a 30% increase in parent participation in school events and two-way communication.

#### Critical Initiatives

- Adopt tools for ongoing, multilingual two-way communication (e.g., TalkingPoints, ClassDojo).
- Offer staff training on building authentic relationships with families, including cultural responsiveness and empathy-building strategies.
- Schedule events at various times (AM/PM/virtual) and offer multiple formats (celebrations, workshops, informal Q&A, etc.).
- Conduct quarterly family and teacher surveys and track event attendance and communication engagement data.
