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What is Title I?

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Pine Hill Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. How is it revised?

Pine Hill Middle School invites all parents to attend input trainings to review and revise this parental involvement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the 1% parental involvement budget. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. In the fall prior to November's 1st annual meeting is held to inform parents of the requirements of Title I and the school's participation, as well as the parent' rights under Title I. We also distribute an annual survey hard copy to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings, workshops, and activities during the school year. If the school wide plan is not satisfactory to parents, the parent facilitator designees will submit feedback forms to the LEA.

Who is it for?

All Pine Hill Middle School students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Pine Hill Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student handbook that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will provide a hard copy to all parents in August during the scheduled open house event. If Open House is virtual, parents will receive a link to view the plan at their leisure. We will also provide copies in the main office. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2022-2023 District Goals

During the 2022-23 school year, we will utilize technology and the Richmond County School System Instructional Framework to increase academic achievement across all tested content areas by 3%.

During the 2022-23 school year, through our Induction Support Program, we will increase the percentage of highly effective teachers and leaders retained in the Richmond County School System by 3%.

During the 2022-23 school year, we will increase the graduation rate from 73.77% to 75% by a continued focus on the strategy map and working to produce graduates that meet the Richmond County System Profile of a Graduate.
